For instance, in the past 23 years that the Agape Center has run it's after-school ministry, God has provided just enough staff and volunteers to effectively disciple the young people in the program. We have noticed a trend however, that very few of these volunteers have been men, and very few have been people of color. Being based in a predominately African-American community has fueled our desire to see a more ethnically diverse ministry team. And we earnestly desire to see more men working with us so that the young boys in the ministry have godly male role models that they can bond with.

Over the past several months, our team has been actively seeking God for wisdom on ways that we can attract more men and people of color to join our staff team and volunteer team. In fact, we have decided to make this

one of our "Wildly Important Goals" that we will focus much of our attention, energy, and resources toward seeing accomplished.

We praise God for the ways that we already see Him at work. Although there are currently only two men on our full-time staff team (Brad and Marc), God has raised up two men to serve as part-time staff. Will and Wade are both college students and have agreed to raise support to join us so that they can work 10-20 hours a week on our team!

Will is currently attending Moody Bible Institute and he has been

giving leadership to our teen basketball team for the past few years. He recently got married, and his wife, Kara, is also joining us as a volunteer this year as she serves with the SAY Yes! ministry.

Wade is a young man we have written about in the past. When he was in high school, he began attending programs at the Agape Center and came to have faith in Christ. He has served on two "Summer in the City" projects (one in Chicago and the other in India). He has also served as a volunteer leader in SAY Yes! and Day Camp for the past few years. He is currently a junior in college with hopes of joining staff full-time after he graduates. He is one of the "regulars" in Marc's men's Bible Study.
