# **Using This Study**

## **O EXAMINE His Word**

What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

## **9 EXPLORE His Word**

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

#### **© EMBRACE His Word**

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.





This week in our study of the book of Mark, we come to a very challenging topic for today's church. The Pharisees question Jesus about divorce. The Pharisees are not concerned with the correct answer, they are simply testing Jesus. They are trying to trap Him, and reduce His influence with the people. The Pharisees already have an opinion on the matter. There are two different camps and both of them permit divorce in the Jewish tradition. Jesus' answer does not take one side or the other. Instead, He gets to the heart of the issue and gives a different perspective on divorce.

# **Read Mark 10:1-12 (NET)**

<sup>1</sup> Then Jesus left that place and went to the region of Judea and beyond the Jordan River. Again crowds gathered to him, and again, as was his custom, he taught them. <sup>2</sup> Then some Pharisees came, and to test him they asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?" 3 He answered them, "What did Moses command you?" <sup>4</sup> They said, "Moses permitted a man to write a certificate of dismissal and to divorce her." <sup>5</sup> But Jesus said to them. "He wrote this commandment for you because of your hard hearts. <sup>6</sup> But from the beginning of creation he

made them male and female. <sup>7</sup> For this reason a man will leave his father and mother, 8 and the two will become one flesh. So they are no longer two, but one flesh. <sup>9</sup> Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

<sup>10</sup> In the house once again, the disciples asked him about this. 11 So he told them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her. 12 And if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adulterv."
