O EXAMINE His Word


What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

@ EXPLORE His Word

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

© EMBRACE His Word

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.





This week we look at the last Psalm in our Psalms series. Psalm 98 is a Psalm about praising the Lord. It includes reason for praising the Lord and how we should praise the Lord. It talks of the salvation that we are offered and that we should praise Him joyfully. All the earth sings praises to God, and we are called to acknowledge His glory along with the rest of creation. The Lord is worthy of our praise because He is faithful and just and has delivered us from His judgment.

Read Psalm 98 (NET)

- ¹Sing to the Lord a new song, for he performs amazing deeds! His right hand and his mighty arm accomplish deliverance.
- ²The Lord demonstrates his power to deliver; in the sight of the nations he reveals his justice.
- ³ He remains loyal and faithful to the family of Israel. All the ends of the earth see our God deliver us.
- ⁴ Shout out praises to the Lord, all the earth! Break out in a joyful shout and sing!
- ⁵ Sing to the Lord accompanied by a harp, accompanied by a harp and the sound of music!

- ⁶ With trumpets and the blaring of the ram's horn, shout out praises before the king, the Lord!
- ⁷ Let the sea and everything in it shout, along with the world and those who live in it!
- ⁸ Let the rivers clap their hands! Let the mountains sing in unison

⁹ before the Lord!

For he comes to judge the earth! He judges the world fairly, and the nations in a just manner.
