© EMBRACE His Word

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.





This week we are in Chapter 9 of Proverbs. In chapter 9 two women are portrayed: one women representing wisdom and the other women representing folly. Both women invite people in to dine with them. In different ways both have an aspect of appeal. However, only one is truly a wise choice. This week we will talk about making the wise choice and how we can choose to reflect the person of wisdom not the person of wickedness.

Proverbs 9 (NASB)

Wisdom's Invitation

9 Wisdom has built her house,

She has hewn out her seven pillars;

² She has prepared her food, she has mixed her wine;

She has also set her table;

³ She has sent out her maidens, she calls From the tops of the heights of the city:

⁴ "Whoever is naive, let him turn in here!"

To him who lacks understanding she says,

⁵ "Come, eat of my food

And drink of the wine I have mixed.

⁶ "Forsake *your* folly and live,

And proceed in the way of understanding."

⁷ He who corrects a scoffer gets dishonor for himself,

And he who reproves a wicked man *gets* insults for himself.

⁸ Do not reprove a scoffer, or he will hate you, Reprove a wise man and he will love you.

⁹ Give *instruction* to a wise man and he will be still wiser,

Teach a righteous man and he will increase *his* learning.

¹⁰ The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom,

And the knowledge of the Holy One is understanding.

¹¹ For by me your days will be multiplied, And years of life will be added to you.

¹² If you are wise, you are wise for yourself, And if you scoff, you alone will bear it.

¹³ The woman of folly is boisterous,

She is naive and knows nothing.

¹⁴ She sits at the doorway of her house,

On a seat by the high places of the city,

¹⁵ Calling to those who pass by,

Who are making their paths straight:

¹⁶ "Whoever is naive, let him turn in here,"

And to him who lacks understanding she says,

¹⁷ "Stolen water is sweet;

And bread eaten in secret is pleasant."

¹⁸ But he does not know that the dead are there,

That her guests are in the depths of Sheol.
