What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.


9 EXPLORE His Word

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.





This week we will look at Psalm 8. Many of the Psalms provide wonderful insight to God's glory and majesty. In this passage, we see the psalmist declaring the glory of God's handy work in all of creation. He also reveals the responsibility of mankind— God entrusted His creation to man, that man might rule over it. God, in all His glory and power, has given man the responsibility to be a good steward over His creation. While man is weak, God reveals His glory and strength through weakness. Are you honoring God with all He has entrusted to you?
