Galatians 1:23-24



This week we will look at the second half of the first chapter of Galatians. In this section Paul talks about his dramatic transformation from persecuting the church to being a minister of the Gospel. Paul's conversion is undoubtedly hard for some to believe. However, for those that understand, it gives them reason to praise the Lord. Paul does not receive the Gospel in the same way that the other apostles do. While the others had been evewitnesses to the life of Jesus and His death on the cross, Paul is not. However, Paul receives the Gospel strait from the Lord. It is important for us to know that the Gospel Paul receives and the Gospel the others witness is truly the same, giving us confidence in the one true Gospel.

Read Galatians 1:11-24 (NET)

¹¹ Now I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that the gospel I preached is not of human origin. ¹² For I did not receive it or learn it from any human source; instead I received it by a revelation of Jesus Christ.

¹³ For you have heard of my former way of life in Judaism, how I was savagely persecuting the church of God and trying to destroy it. ¹⁴ I was advancing in Judaism beyond many of my contemporaries in my nation, and was extremely zealous for the traditions of my ancestors. ¹⁵ But when the one who set me apart from birth and called me by his grace was pleased ¹⁶ to reveal his Son in me so that I could preach him among the Gentiles, I did not go to ask advice from any human being,

¹⁷ nor did I go up to Jerusalem to see those who were apostles before me, but right away I departed to Arabia, and then returned to Damascus.

¹⁸ Then after three years I went up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas and get information from him, and I stayed with him fifteen days. ¹⁹ But I saw none of the other apostles except James the Lord's brother. ²⁰ I assure you that, before God, I am not lying about what I am writing to you! ²¹ Afterward I went to the regions of Syria and Cilicia. ²² But I was personally unknown to the churches of Judea that are in Christ. ²³ They were only hearing, "The one who once persecuted us is now proclaiming the good news of the faith he once tried to destroy."
