

Faith Has a Voice

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1 THESSALONIANS 1:1-10

This Week's Core Competency:

Giving Away My Faith:

I give away my faith to fulfill God's purposes.

Pray also for me, that the message may be given to me when I open my mouth to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel. For this I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I might be bold enough in Him to speak as I should. Tychicus, our dearly loved brother and faithful servant in the Lord, will tell you all the news about me so that you may be informed. (Ephesians 6:19-21)

Using This Study

❶ EXAMINE His Word

What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

❷ EXPLORE His Word

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

❸ EXPAND His Word

How does this FIT? Studying cross references can help expand your understanding of a passage and discover the unity in God's word.

❹ EMBRACE His Word

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.

Actions Speak Louder Than Words

Have you ever told someone you would do something and then failed to actually do it? Have you ever been promised something only to be let down? In such situations, we discover the truth of the familiar saying "actions speak louder than words."

Mother Teresa worked amongst the poorest of the poor in India. For over 50 years, she dedicated her life to helping orphans, those who were sick, and marginalized by society. Mother Teresa must have had this concept of actions speaking louder than words figured out. She never preached a sermon; instead, she worked joyfully in the slums of Calcutta. The way that she lived her life was an emphatic declaration of what she believed. In an interview several years before she died she stated, "People do not expect from the church a constant flow of statements. Instead they expect love, care, and concern. Their statements will be made through their lives and their commitments to Christ."

Everything speaks. What does your life say to others? Are others blessed by the beauty that flows from Christ through you? As a result of interacting with you, do others experience anything of the radical love, joy, mercy and forgiveness that comes from a relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ? Does being around you make others hunger for Jesus?

This Week

The Thessalonians lived in a way that caused the people from surrounding areas to take note. They became models for other believers. As your study this passage, ask God to make your life a testimony.

① EXAMINE His Word

What does God SAY? Prayerfully note significant details and terms emphasized in the passage.

Acts 17:1-9

1 Then they traveled through Amphipolis and Apollonia and came to Thessalonica, where there was a Jewish synagogue.

2 As usual, Paul went to the synagogue, and on three Sabbath days reasoned with them from the Scriptures,

3 explaining and showing that the Messiah had to suffer and rise from the dead: “This Jesus I am proclaiming to you is the Messiah.”

4 Then some of them were persuaded and joined Paul and Silas, including a great number of God-fearing Greeks, as well as a number of the leading women.

5 But the Jews became jealous, and they brought together some scoundrels from the marketplace, formed a mob, and started a riot in the city. Attacking Jason’s house, they searched for them to bring them out to the public assembly.

6 When they did not find them, they dragged Jason and some of the brothers before the city officials, shouting, “These men who have turned the world upside down have come here too,

7 and Jason has received them as guests! They are all acting contrary to Caesar’s decrees, saying that there is another king—Jesus!”

8 The Jews stirred up the crowd and the city officials who heard these things.

9 So taking a security bond from Jason and the others, they released them.

10 As soon as it was night, the brothers sent Paul and Silas off to Berea. On arrival, they went

into the synagogue of the Jews.

1 Thessalonians 1:1-10

1 Paul, **Silvanus, and Timothy**: To the **church** of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Grace to you and peace.

2 We always thank God for all of you, remembering you constantly in our prayers.

3 We recall, in the presence of our God and Father, your work of faith, labor of love, and endurance of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ,

4 knowing your election, brothers loved by God.

5 For our gospel did not come to you in word only, but also in power, in the Holy Spirit, and with much assurance. You know what kind of men we were among you for your benefit,

6 and you became imitators of us and of the Lord when, in spite of severe persecution, you welcomed the message with joy from the Holy Spirit.

7 As a result, you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and Achaia.

8 For the Lord’s message **rang out** from you, not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but in every place that your faith in God has gone out. Therefore, we don’t need to say anything,

9 for they themselves report what kind of reception we had from you: how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God

10 and to wait for His Son from heaven, whom He raised from the dead —Jesus, who rescues us from the coming wrath.

Notes

(1 Th 1:1)- **Silvanus** and **Timothy** were coworkers with Paul during his second missionary journey. Silvanus, or Silas, was a Judean Christian (Acts 15:22) who joined Paul after he separated from Barnabas (Acts 15:39–40). Timothy, of Lystra in south Galatia, was a son of a Jewish mother and Greek father and became partners with Paul when Paul passed through his hometown early on his second journey.

(1 Th 1:1)-The word “**church**” in Gk. is *ekklesia*,

which means “a called-out group.” The church is not a social club; it is a spiritual organism.

(1Th 1:8)-The word *exēchētai*, translated rang out, could be rendered “reverberated.” Paul’s preaching in Thessalonica had the effect of speaking into a public address microphone; his words were received and repeated by many different “speakers” in many remote places where his unaided voice could not have reached.
