### Using This Study

#### ❶ EXAMINE His Word

What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

#### ❷ EXPLORE His Word

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

#### ❸ EMBRACE His Word

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.

*We know also that the Son of God has come  
and has given us understanding, so that  
we may know Him who is true  
And we are in Him, even in His Son, Jesus Christ  
He is the True God and Eternal Life.  
1 John 5:20*

In Chapter 39 of Genesis the Joseph story continues. Joseph is sold into slavery in Egypt to Potiphar, Pharaoh's captain of the bodyguard. Here Joseph is tested as Potiphar's wife makes advances toward him. Joseph maintains his integrity and does not "sin against God". However, Joseph is framed by Potiphar's wife and is thrown into prison despite his honorable actions. As when he was in Potiphar's house God continues to be with Joseph in prison. God helps him to rise to a position of leadership even within the prison. Sometimes it is hard to understand why we face trials but we can be confident that if we stay faithful through the trial God will always be with us. Join us this week as we look at the trials we may face and how we can stay faithful and even be used as a blessing to others while in the mist of trials.



## Joseph's Success in Egypt

**39** Now Joseph had been taken down to Egypt; and Potiphar, an Egyptian officer of Pharaoh, the captain of the bodyguard, bought him from the Ishmaelites, who had taken him down there. <sup>2</sup>The LORD was with Joseph, so he became a successful man. And he was in the house of his master, the Egyptian. <sup>3</sup>Now his master saw that the LORD was with him and *how* the LORD caused all that he did to prosper in his hand. <sup>4</sup>So Joseph found favor in his sight and became his personal servant; and he made him overseer over his house, and all that he owned he put in his charge. <sup>5</sup>It came about that from the time he made him overseer in his house and over all that he owned, the LORD blessed the Egyptian's house on account of Joseph; thus the LORD'S blessing was upon all that he owned, in the house and in the field. <sup>6</sup>So he left everything he owned in Joseph's charge; and with him *there* he did not concern himself with anything except the food which he ate.

Now Joseph was handsome in form and appearance. <sup>7</sup>It came about after these events that his master's wife looked with desire at Joseph, and she said, "Lie with me." <sup>8</sup>But he refused and said to his master's wife, "Behold, with me *here*, my master does not concern himself with anything in the house, and he has put all that he owns in my charge. <sup>9</sup>There is no one greater in this house than I, and he has withheld nothing from me except you, because you are his wife. How then could I do this great evil and sin against God?" <sup>10</sup>As she spoke to Joseph day after day, he did not listen to her to lie beside her *or* be with her. <sup>11</sup>Now it happened one day that he went into the house to do his work, and

none of the men of the household was there inside. <sup>12</sup>She caught him by his garment, saying, "Lie with me!" And he left his garment in her hand and fled, and went outside. <sup>13</sup>When she saw that he had left his garment in her hand and had fled outside, <sup>14</sup>she called to the men of her household and said to them, "See, he has brought in a Hebrew to us to make sport of us; he came in to me to lie with me, and I screamed. <sup>15</sup>When he heard that I raised my voice and screamed, he left his garment beside me and fled and went outside." <sup>16</sup>So she left his garment beside her until his master came home. <sup>17</sup>Then she spoke to him with these words, "The Hebrew slave, whom you brought to us, came in to me to make sport of me; <sup>18</sup>and as I raised my voice and screamed, he left his garment beside me and fled outside."

## Joseph Imprisoned

<sup>19</sup>Now when his master heard the words of his wife, which she spoke to him, saying, "This is what your slave did to me," his anger burned. <sup>20</sup>So Joseph's master took him and put him into the jail, the place where the king's prisoners were confined; and he was there in the jail. <sup>21</sup>But the LORD was with Joseph and extended kindness to him, and gave him favor in the sight of the chief jailer. <sup>22</sup>The chief jailer committed to Joseph's charge all the prisoners who were in the jail; so that whatever was done there, he was responsible *for it*. <sup>23</sup>The chief jailer did not supervise anything under Joseph's charge because the LORD was with him; and whatever he did, the LORD made to prosper.

2. Where and when is this taking place? Geography and timeline.

5. What is emphasized?
6. Is there anything in these passages that is related to other areas of scripture?
7. Are there things to be noted that are alike or unlike such as similes and metaphors?

8. Why was Joseph successful in Egypt?

9. Why did Joseph refuse the advances of Potiphar's wife? (v.9)

10. Why do you think Potiphar's wife framed him?

11. What could Joseph have done differently?

12. Do you think Joseph felt blessed while he was in jail?

13. How would it have been better or worse for Joseph if he had given into Potiphar's wife?

**③ EMBRACE His Word (Application)** (For Community Group discussion)  
Why does this MATTER to me?

13. Joseph's faith is tested in slavery and in jail. How has your faith been tested?

14. How does your integrity affect your ability to be a blessing to others? Give some examples.

15. What can we do now to prepare ourselves for when our faith is tested?

16. What did Joseph have control over when we arrived in Egypt? How does this apply to us?
