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Using This Study

O EXAMINE His Word

What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

@ EXPLORE His Word

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

© EMBRACE His Word

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.





Today we continue to look at selected Psalms and will be studying Psalm 24. Psalm 24 talks about coming into the presence of the Lord. We must not sit back and be complacent but must prepare for His coming. No one knows the hour or even the Day in which the Lord Jesus will return. However, there are things that we would all do to prepare if we did know. Today we will have the opportunity to discuss some of the things we should be doing even though we don't know when it will happen. As the Boy Scouts say, we must "be prepared". For us as Christians the Psalm tells us that being prepared is having clean hands and a pure heart.

Read Psalm 24 (NET)

¹ The Lord owns the earth and all it contains, the world and all who live in it.

² For he set its foundation upon the seas, and established it upon the ocean currents.

³ Who is allowed to ascend the mountain of the Lord?

Who may go up to his holy dwelling place?

⁴ The one whose deeds are blameless and whose motives are pure, who does not lie, or make promises with no intention of keeping them.

⁵ Such godly people are rewarded by the Lord, and vindicated by the God who delivers them.

⁶ Such purity characterizes the people who seek his favor,
Jacob's descendants, who pray to him. (Selah)
