

## The Secret to Joy

PHILIPPIANS 1:12-19

### Core Competency:

**Joy-** I have inner contentment and purpose in spite of my circumstances.

*If you keep My commands you will remain in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commands and remain in His love. "I have spoken these things to you so that My joy may be in you and your joy may be complete. (John 15:10-11)*

### Using This Study

#### ❶ EXAMINE His Word

### Introduction

Although Turkey is a secular country with no official religion, approximately 99% percent of the population is registered as Muslim. In the early nineties, a Turkish newspaper, with a large distribution, exposed an entire Christian missionary community in Ankara. They published the missionaries' names and addresses, explained what they were doing, and listed discipleship material they had been using. It seemed that the Ankara missionary efforts had been critically wounded. However, the newspaper made one mistake. They printed the phone number where people were supposed to call to request a free copy of the discipleship book they used. Within one week, over six hundred Turks had called in for their free copies! While their immediate circumstances became quite difficult, the gospel was being advanced!

This is the same sentiment that Paul expressed in this week's passage. When Paul wrote to the Philippians, he was in prison. As if that was not frustrating enough, "others" seemed to come out of the woodwork intent on stirring up trouble for him. While Paul could have viewed these circumstances as a giant roadblock to God's plan, he saw it as an opportunity. That is because Paul trusted God. He knew, even as we can know, that when we place our lives in God's hands, no trouble or hardship goes to waste. His trust wasn't tied to certain circumstances or a specific outcome. His faith and his hope were bound up in God's redemptive purposes for this world. Thus he could rejoice regardless of what was happening to him.

### This Week

As you study this passage, reflect on the wonder of your salvation through Jesus Christ. Thank God for His provision for your sin. Ask God to use every part of your life to proclaim the gospel. Finally, humbly rejoice, because God is willing to use you, in whatever circumstance you may find yourself, to spread the good news of Jesus Christ to a world that is desperately in need.

## ❶ EXAMINE His Word

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What does God SAY? The words God uses to communicate matters so pay close attention to the details emphasized or repeated in the passage:

### **Philippians 1:12-19**

12 Now I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has actually resulted in the advance of the gospel,

13 so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard, and to everyone else, that my imprisonment is in the cause of Christ.

14 Most of the brothers in the Lord have gained confidence from my imprisonment and dare even more to speak the message fearlessly.

15 To be sure, some preach Christ out of envy and strife, but others out of good will.

16 These do so out of love, knowing that I am

appointed for the defense of the gospel;

17 the others proclaim Christ out of rivalry, not sincerely, seeking to cause me anxiety in my imprisonment.

18 What does it matter? Just that in every way, whether out of false motives or true, Christ is proclaimed. And in this I rejoice. Yes, and I will rejoice

19 because I know this will lead to my deliverance through your prayers and help from the Spirit of Jesus Christ.  
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## ❷ DISCOVER His Word

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What does God MEAN? Answer the following questions and then bring to your COMMUNITY GROUP to discover and discuss with others.

1. a) Describe Paul's current unfavorable circumstance.  
  
b) Read Acts 9:10-16. In light of this passage, how are some of Paul's circumstances better understood?  
  
c) What were/are some of the positive results that stemmed from Paul's current imprisonment?
2. What are some ways that a believer can maintain a circumspect view of things in spite of adversity? (It may be helpful to think about some of the ways in which you find yourself discouraged).

3. What do the following passages indicate about God's ability to use all circumstances for his glory? If you have time, consider the extraordinarily difficult circumstances that are the context for each of the passages.

- Genesis 50:20

- Esther 4:14

- Daniel 3:17-18

4. a) How is your perspective, your attitude, and even your relationship with the Lord affected by your circumstances or your expectations?

b) How might faith and trust potentially change your perspective?

5. Think about those described in verses 15-17. What do you think that this passage may suggest about our motives and God's ability to use us?

6. What, if anything, can you do so that your life would more continuously proclaim the gospel in spite of difficulty? (Be as specific as possible).

## Sermon Notes:

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### ③LIVE His Word

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How does this truth FIT? God's word is lived in real life so engage with truth in your LIFEGROUP.

Some people defend preachers of the popular “health-and-wealth” gospel by applying vv. 15-19. For example, the typical application of this verse is seen in statements like:

*“We should not make a big deal or condemn preachers of false health-and-wealth gospel teaching (like what is rampant on television) because they agree that Jesus is the Christ and the only way to heaven. We should be glad that Jesus is preached.”*

As a group, discuss the appropriateness of such an application. Is this what Paul meant? Why or why not?
