

Kings Ride Horses

Week's Core Competency:

Using This Study

O EXAMINE His Word

What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

@ EXPLORE His Word

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

© EMBRACE His Word

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.

Introduction:

Historically, kings ride horses! But this King rode an unbroken donkey—a symbol of humility and peace. Jesus rode into Jerusalem, not as a conqueror on a white stallion—that would come later--but as a humble King "endowed with salvation."

"Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout in triumph, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; He is just and endowed with salvation, Humble, and mounted on a donkey, Even on a colt, the foal of a donkey" (Zechariah 9:9).

One week before His crucifixion, Jesus formally presented Himself as the Messiah-King of Israel. The crowds were celebrating. They were laying down palm branches on the roadway for Jesus. They were singing Messianic psalms. "Hosanna to the Son of David; Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD" (Psalm 118:26). To them Jesus represented a kind of prosperity and freedom from Roman rule.

In contrast to this scene, in Revelation 19:11-16 at the end of the tribulation period, Jesus is seen coming out of heaven riding on a white horse. In Revelation 20:16, the words, KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS were written on His robe. He will no longer ride in humility on the back of a donkey. He never again will ride into Jerusalem in preparation for His crucifixion.

In His First Coming, Jesus came to die; in His Second Coming, He returns as a conquering King to reign on His Millennial Kingdom on earth. On Palm Sunday, Jesus presented Himself as King to the Nation Israel. But later they rejected Him and demanded that He be crucified.

O EXAMINE His Word

What does God SAY? Prayerfully note significant details and terms emphasized in the passage.

Read Matthew 21:1-11 (NASB)

- ¹ When they had approached Jerusalem and had come to Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples,
- ² saying to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied *there* and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to Me.
- ³ If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord has need of them,' and immediately he will send them''
- ⁴ This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet (Zechariah 9:9):
 - ⁵ "SAY TO THE DAUGHTER OF ZION,
 'BEHOLD YOUR KING IS COMING TO YOU,
 GENTLE, AND MOUNTED ON A DONKEY,
 EVEN ON A COLT, THE FOAL OF A BEAST OF
 BURDEN.""

- ⁶ The disciples went and did just as Jesus had instructed them,
- ⁷ and brought the donkey and the colt, and laid their coats on them; and He sat on the coats.
- ⁸ Most of the crowd spread their coats in the road, and others were cutting branches from the trees and spreading them in the road.
- ⁹ The crowds going ahead of Him, and those who followed, were shouting,

"Hosanna to the Son of David; BLESSED IS HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD (PSALM 118:26); Hosanna in the highest!"

- ¹⁰ When He had entered Jerusalem, all the city was stirred, saying, "Who is this?"
- ¹¹ And the crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth in Galilee."

What does God MEAN?

1. a. What do you think is the significance of the reference to Zechariah 9:9?

b. Why is it important to indicate that Jesus' actions were a fulfillment of Scripture?

2.	In verse 6, what is learned about the disciples? How can their actions challenge you in your Christian life?
3.	What prompted the owner of the donkeys to turn over the use of his animals to a stranger with the words, "The Lord needs them?" (Matthew 21:6-7)
4.	Compare Matthew 21:1-11 with Matthew 27:21-26. How do the attitudes and actions differ between those who were present at these two events?
