Using This Study

❶ EXAMINE His Word

What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

❷ EXPLORE His Word

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

❸ EMBRACE His Word

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.

INTRODUCTION

Typical of the Pauline epistles, Paul's letter to the Colossian Church, the opening 14 verses contains a Salutation, a Praise, and then a prayer of Petition. Today we will look at his Prayer of Petition in verses 9 through 14.

① EXAMINE His Word

What does God SAY? Prayerfully note significant details and terms emphasized in the passage.

Read Colossians 1:9-14

⁹For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives,

¹⁰so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God,

¹¹being strengthened with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience,

¹²and giving joyful thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of his holy people in the kingdom of light.

¹³For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves,

¹⁴in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

② EXPLORE His Word

OBSERVATIONS:

1. How many elements of his prayer can you name (what were his requests)?
2. How often did Paul pray for the Colossian Church?
3. Today we have a “cottage industry” developed around “Knowing the Will of God.” What was Paul’s take on the will of God?

INTERPRETATION:

1. In this paragraph, what did Paul mean when he dealt with God's Will?
2. Paul prayed for the church to have *wisdom and understanding*. What is the difference between these two terms?
3. Paul's second petition grows out of his request for knowledge of the Divine Will; that they would "...live a life worthy of the Lord." What does that mean?

APPLICATION:

1. A third request is that the Colossians "may please Him (God) in every way." Is there a difference between our *Position in Christ*, and our *Practical Living in Christ*?

2. If there is a difference, how do I live a life “pleasing to Him,” in this context?

3. A fourth element of living a life “pleasing to the Lord” is to the “giving of thanks.” In the context, tell what is the chief reason for us to be able to be people constantly giving thanks to the Lord.

③ EMBRACE His Word
