# **Using This Study**

#### **O EXAMINE** His Word

What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

### **@ EXPLORE His Word**

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

### **© EMBRACE His Word**

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.

#### Introduction

As J. W. Thompson has observed, 'a catalogue of heroes of *pistis*, introduced as patterns of imitation, is unthinkable in any Greek tradition.'389 The reason for this is that to the formally educated person, *pistis*, 'faith,' was regarded as a state of mind characteristic of the uneducated, who believe something on hearsay without being able to give precise reasons for their belief. The willingness of Jews and Christians to suffer for the undemonstrable astonished pagan observers. Yet this is precisely the conduct praised in Heb 11:1-40. This fact constitutes the note of offense in this section of the homily.

S. Mark Haywood II currently serves as the Vice President and Chief Financial Officer for The Institute for Theological Studies (ITS). At the age of 6-years-old God revealed to Mark that he had a divine calling on his life, and at the age of 10-years-old Mark became saved. Subsequently, Mark earned a Master of Science degree in Finance from the University of Houston – Clear Lake in Houston, TX and a Master Certificate in Applied Project Management from Villanova University in Philadelphia, PA in 2009.

Mark serves as Youth Pastor for God's Household of Faith in Dickinson, TX mentoring young believers ages 13-18 to become "Grounded in the Word, and Ready for the World." He is a co-founder of H&H Praise Ministries, in which he has taught, promoted, and spread the Gospel through the pantomime art form since 1996. Currently, as VP & CFO of ITS, he utilizes his budgeting, accounting, and financial analysis skills to aide ITS as they fulfill their mission to educate the body of Christ.

### **O EXAMINE His Word**

What does God SAY? Prayerfully note significant details and terms emphasized in the passage.

#### Read Hebrews 11:1-6

- <sup>1</sup> Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.
- <sup>2</sup> For by it the elders obtained a *good* testimony.
- <sup>3</sup> By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible.
- <sup>4</sup> By faith Abel offered to God a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, through which he obtained witness that he was righteous, God testifying of his gifts; and through it he being dead still speaks.
- <sup>5</sup> By faith Enoch was taken away so that he did not see death, "AND WAS NOT FOUND, BECAUSE GOD HAD TAKEN HIM"; for before he was taken he had this testimony, that he pleased God.
- <sup>6</sup> But without faith *it is* impossible to please *Him*, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and *that* He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him.

2) Why did the author use Abel as an example of faith? How did God reward him for his faithfulness?

4)	Why is it impossible to please God without faith?
