

# **Our Hope is in What God is Doing**

#### 1 THESSALONIANS 5:12-28

#### Week's Core Competency:

#### Introduction

**Peace-** I am free from anxiety because things are right between God, me, and others.

Don't worry about anything, but in everything, through prayer and petition with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God. (Philippians 4:6) And the peace of God, which surpasses every thought, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:7)

## **Using This Study**

### • EXAMINE His Word

What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

#### **@ EXPLORE** His Word

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

#### **€ EMBRACE His Word**

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.

In 1933, a bowling enthusiast named Bill Knox bowled a flawless game. He made a perfect strike on all 12 frames. Certainly, this was a reflection of his love for the sport and evidence of the hours of practice that he put in each week. However, if this was all that he accomplished, it is hardly noteworthy. What made his accomplishment truly remarkable? Mr. Knox bowled a perfect game without ever seeing the bowling pins. He was demonstrating the efficacy of something that he called "spot bowling". He had a screen set up just inside the foul line that completely blocked his view of the pins and all but the closest 2-3 feet of the lane. He then aimed at a selected spot on the floor a few feet in front of him that he knew was in line with the pins. Spot bowling proved to be an accepted way of ensuring consistency and accuracy. You see, Knox understood that you can be more effective when you focus on a spot near to you that is also in line with the pins.

Spot bowling illustrates part of a wise approach to life. When Paul wrote to the Thessalonians about the return of Christ, he reminded them that the ultimate goal of their salvation was to "be blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ." Paul taught them to focus their eyes on near actions that were in line with that goal. He urged them to comfort one another, help the weak, warn the wayward, pray without ceasing, and rejoice always. Then he added that we must do this in the power of Christ who is working in us.

#### This Week

As you study this week, look for practical ways to apply Paul's final instructions to your everyday life. Listen for the Holy Spirit's quiet voice as He leads you. Choose to live in a way that reflects your love for the Lord, is consistent with your calling in Christ, and allows the Spirit freedom to work in and through you. "The one who calls you is faithful and he will do it."

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## **0 EXAMINE His Word**

What does God SAY? Prayerfully note significant details and terms emphasized in the passage.

#### 1 Thessalonians 5:12-28

12 Now we ask you, brothers, to give recognition to those who labor among you and lead you in the Lord and admonish you,

13 and to regard them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves.

14 And we exhort you, brothers: warn those who are irresponsible, comfort the discouraged, help the weak, be patient with everyone.

15 See to it that no one repays evil for evil to anyone, but always pursue what is good for one another and for all.

16 Rejoice always!

17 Pray constantly.

18 Give thanks in everything, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

## **@EXPLORE** His Word

#### What does God MEAN?

- 19 Don't stifle the Spirit.
- 20 Don't despise prophecies,
- 21 but test all things. Hold on to what is good.
- 22 Stay away from every kind of evil.

23 Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely. And may your spirit, soul, and body be kept sound and blameless for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

24 He who calls you is faithful, who also will do it.
