What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

#### **@** EXPLORE His Word


What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

### EMBRACE His Word

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.

"The LORD said to Abram, 'Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you."" (Genesis 12:1)





This week we see the introduction of Abram who later in scripture is called Abraham. Abram is called by God to leave his family and travel to Canaan. The land is promised to Abram and his descendants. Abram receives great blessings from God. This week we will look at the obedience that Abram had and the blessings that he received. Does blessing only come from obedience? Does our obedience receive more blessing? These are a couple of the questions that we will be looking to answer this week as we study the call of Abram.

## Genesis 11:27-12:20 (NASB)

<sup>27</sup> Now these are *the records of* the generations of Terah. Terah became the father of Abram, Nahor and Haran; and Haran became the father of Lot. <sup>28</sup> Haran died in the presence of his father Terah in the land of his birth, in Ur of the Chaldeans. <sup>29</sup> Abram and Nahor took wives for themselves. The name of Abram's wife was Sarai; and the name of Nahor's wife was Milcah, the daughter of Haran, the father of Milcah and Iscah. <sup>30</sup> Sarai was barren; she had no child.

<sup>31</sup> Terah took Abram his son, and Lot the son of Haran, his grandson, and Sarai his daughter-in-law, his son Abram's wife; and they went out together from Ur of the Chaldeans in order to enter the land of Canaan; and they went as far as Haran, and settled there. <sup>32</sup> The days of Terah were two hundred and five years; and Terah died in Haran.

# Abram Journeys to Egypt

12 Now the LORD said to Abram,

"Go forth from your country, And from your relatives And from your father's house, To the land which I will show you; <sup>2</sup> And I will make you a great nation, And I will bless you, And make your name great; And so you shall be a blessing; <sup>3</sup> And I will bless those who bless you, And the one who curses you I will curse. And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed."

<sup>4</sup> So Abram went forth as the LORD had spoken to him; and Lot went with him. Now Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran. <sup>5</sup> Abram took Sarai his wife and Lot his nephew, and all their possessions which they had accumulated, and the persons which they had acquired in Haran, and they set out for the land of Canaan; thus they came to the land of Canaan. <sup>6</sup> Abram passed through the land as far as the site of Shechem, to the oak of Moreh. Now the Canaanite was then in the land. <sup>7</sup> The LORD appeared to Abram and said, "To your descendants I will give this land." So he built an altar there to the LORD who had appeared to him. <sup>8</sup>Then he proceeded from there to the mountain on the east of Bethel, and pitched his tent, with Bethel on the west and Ai on the east; and there he built an altar to the LORD and called upon the name of the LORD. 9 Abram journeyed on, continuing toward the Negev.

<sup>10</sup> Now there was a famine in the land; so Abram went down to Egypt to sojourn there, for the famine was severe in the land. <sup>11</sup> It came about when he came near to Egypt, that he said to Sarai his wife, "See now, I know that you are a beautiful woman; <sup>12</sup> and when the Egyptians see you, they will say, 'This is his wife'; and they will kill me, but they will let you live. <sup>13</sup> Please say that you are my sister so that it may go well with me because of you, and that I may live on account of you." <sup>14</sup> It came about when Abram came into Egypt, the Egyptians saw that the woman was very beautiful. <sup>15</sup> Pharaoh's officials saw her and praised her to Pharaoh; and the woman was taken into Pharaoh's house. <sup>16</sup> Therefore he treated Abram well for her sake; and gave him sheep and oxen and donkeys and male and female servants and female donkeys and camels.

<sup>17</sup> But the LORD struck Pharaoh and his house with great plagues because of Sarai, Abram's wife. <sup>18</sup> Then Pharaoh called Abram and said, "What is this you have done to me? Why did you not tell me that she was your wife? <sup>19</sup> Why did you say, 'She is my sister,' so that I took her for my wife? Now then, here is your wife, take her and go." <sup>20</sup> Pharaoh commanded *his* men concerning him; and they escorted him away, with his wife and all that belonged to him.

- 5. What is emphasized?

6. Is there anything in these passages that is related to other areas of scripture?

7. Are there things to be noted that are alike or unalike such as similes and metaphors?

8. Why did Abram travel to Canaan? What were some of the dangers he may have faced?

9. Why did Abram travel to Egypt?

10. Do you think Abram expected to get Sarai back when he gave her up in Egypt?

11. Why do you think Abram was willing to give up Sarai in Egypt?

12. Do you think Abram understood the promise in 12:1-3?

## EMBRACE His Word (Application) (For Community Group discussion) Why does this MATTER to me?

13. Abram receives blessing for his obedience. What is God calling you to be obedient in doing?

14. Do you think God will bless your obedience?

15. What does it look like in your life when God blesses your obedience?
