## This Week's Core **Competency:**

Humility- I choose to esteem others above myself.

Do nothing out of rivalry or conceit, but in humility consider others as more important than yourselves. Everyone should look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others. (Philippians 2:3–4)

# **Using This Study**

### **O EXAMINE His Word**

What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized repeated in the passage.

#### **@ EXPLORE His Word**

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

#### **© EXPAND His Word**

How does this FIT? Studying cross references can help expand your understanding of a passage and discover the unity in God's word.

#### **4 EMBRACE His Word**

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.

### The Power of an Example

"Setting an example isn't the main means to influence another, it is the only means." ~ Albert Einstein Corrie Ten Boom, a famous concentration camp survivor and devoted Christian woman, said this about her father.

"When I was a little girl, my father used to tuck me into bed at night. He talked with me, prayed with me, and laid his big hands on my little face. I did not move because I wanted to keep the feeling of that big hand on my face. It was a comfort to me. Later, when I was in the concentration camp, I would sometimes pray, "My heavenly Father, will you lay your hand on my face?" That would bring me peace, and I would be able to sleep."

Because her father demonstrated a fatherly type of love, Corrie was able to understand the heavenly Father's love. Being an example has a powerful way of illustrating the truths claims that we, as believers, embrace. At its best, a good example serves as a kind of "How To..." manual for concepts like unconditional love, forgiveness, compassion, and kindness.

How effective do you think it would have been if a disengaged father sat at the dinner table each night and told his children, "Kids, I want you to know that God is an ever-present source of comfort and peace"? I have no doubt that these children would soon begin to ignore what their father was saying. On the other hand, an example has a way of authenticating and clarifying a truth. It takes it out of the cognitive realm and weaves it into our experience. This, of course, has the added benefit of anchoring it to our memory.

#### **This Week**

In the scripture passage this week, Paul talks about being an example. The challenge for each of us is to be the kind of person that reflects God's character to those in our sphere of influence. How blessed it would be if, after being involved in your life, someone could say, "I have glimpsed God's heart, and I want nothing less for myself."

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### **O EXAMINE His Word**

What does God SAY? Prayerfully note significant details and terms emphasized in the passage.

### 1 Thessalonians 2:7-12

7 Although we could have been a burden as Christ's apostles, instead we were gentle among you, as a nursing mother nurtures her own children.

8 We cared so much for you that we were pleased to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own lives, because you had become dear to us.

9 For you remember our labor and hardship, brothers. Working night and day so that we would not burden any of you, we preached God's gospel to you.

10 You are witnesses, and so is God, of how devoutly, righteously, and blamelessly we conducted ourselves with you believers.

11 As you know, like a father with his own children,

12 we encouraged, comforted, and implored each one of you to walk worthy of God, who calls you into His own kingdom and glory.

13 This is why we constantly thank God, because when you received the message about God that you heard from us, you welcomed it not as a human message, but as it truly is, the message of God, which also works effectively in you believers.

# **EXPLORE His Word**

### What does God MEAN?

- 1. Paul states that they "could have been a burden as Christ's apostles" (v. 7), what does he mean by that statement? What are some examples of what they could have done as apostles?
- 2. Paul compares the role of a mother (vv. 7-9) and a father (vv. 11, 12) with his ministry approach. Using the words from the text and your own words, describe what you think makes each role distinctive.
- 3. In verse 8, Paul shared the gospel and something more. What was it and why is that important? Or, said another way, why is just sharing the gospel not enough?
- 4. In verse 9, Paul describes toil and hardship. To what was he referring and why was it necessary?

### How does this FIT?

5. Jesus makes a strong statement towards the Pharisees in Matthew 23: 1-7 that is relevant to our passage. Compare the Pharisee's actions with Paul's actions in Thessalonica. How were they different? Be specific.

6. Jesus set the ultimate example for believers. Read Philippians 2:1-11 and list the actions and attitudes of Christ's and compare them with Paul's. In what ways did Paul practice what he preached?

### Why does this MATTER to me?

- 7. In what context or what type of relationship might God call you, as a believer, to be like a mother or a father in your approach to someone else? Explain what that might involve.
- 8. As stated in verse 8, what are some ways for a believer to truly share his or her life with others?
- 9. Being an authentic example to others is the natural result of a growing relationship with God. Think about what you do to strengthen your closest human relationships. Now, apply that to your relationship with the Lord. What could you do to nurture your relationship with God?
