This Week's Core **Competency:**

Using This Study

O EXAMINE His Word

What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

@ EXPLORE His Word

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

© EMBRACE His Word

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.

The Power of an Example

On the morning of December 7, 1941, the Imperial Navy of Japan launched a surprise military attack against the US Naval Base in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. Four US Naval battleships were sunk and four others were damaged. 188 U.S. aircraft were destroyed. 2,402 men were killed and 1,282 wounded. Japanese losses were light: 29 aircraft and five small submarines were lost. 65 Japanese servicemen were either killed or wounded.

The attack came as a profound shock to the American people and led directly to the American entry into World War II. The following day, December 8, the United States declared war on Japan. Domestic support for isolationism, which had been strong, disappeared. Clandestine support of Britain was replaced by active alliance.

In light of the Japanese attack, it would have been unthinkable not to retaliate. What ignited the American people and propelled them toward swift and decisive retribution? Simply this: America clearly saw an enemy willing to kill Americans and destroy all that we hold dear. Somehow, the attack on Pearl Harbor seemed particularly treacherous because Japan hit us on our home turf.

The Bible tells us that, as Christians, we are engaged in a spiritual battle (2 Corinthians 10:3-4). Our enemy, Satan, is real. His agenda is to steal, kill and destroy (John 10:10). How many of us conduct ourselves as if we have an enemy that is seeking to devour us (1 Peter 5:8)? If the devil plotted, through evil men, to destroy Jesus on the cross, we can be sure that he will not hesitate to oppose us.

This Week

This week, as you study 1 Thessalonians 2:13-20, you will see that faith has an adversary, the devil. Will you allow opposition, problems, hardships, and difficulties to keep you discouraged and ineffective? Or, will you engage in the struggle, persevere in spite of opposition, and put on the Armor of God so that He can use you to accomplish His purposes?

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O EXAMINE His Word

What does God SAY? Prayerfully note significant details and terms emphasized in the passage.

1 Thessalonians 2:13-20

13 This is why we constantly thank God, because when you received the message about God that you heard from us, you welcomed it not as a human message, but as it truly is, the message of God, which also works effectively in you believers. 14 For you, brothers, became imitators of God's churches in Christ Jesus that are in Judea, since you have also suffered the same things from people of your own country, just as they did from the Jews

15 who killed both the Lord Jesus and the prophets and persecuted us; they displease God and are hostile to everyone,

16 hindering us from speaking to the Gentiles so that they may be saved. As a result, they are always completing the number of their sins, and wrath has overtaken them at last.

17 But as for us, brothers, after we were forced to leave you for a short time (in person, not in heart), we greatly desired and made every effort to return and see you face to face.

18 So we wanted to come to you—even I, Paul, time and again—but Satan hindered us.
19 For who is our hope or joy or crown of boasting in the presence of our Lord Jesus at His coming? Is it not you?
20 For you are our glory and joy!
