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Using This Study

❶ EXAMINE His Word

What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

❷ EXPLORE His Word

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

❸ EMBRACE His Word

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.

EXAMINE His Word (Observation)

What does God SAY? Prayerfully note significant details and terms emphasized in these passages.

Read Proverbs 27:17 (NET)

¹⁷ As iron sharpens iron,
so a person sharpens his friend.

Read Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 (NET)

⁹Two people are better than one, because they
can reap more benefit from their labor.

¹⁰ For if they fall, one will help his companion
up, but pity the person who falls down and has
no one to help him up.

¹¹ Furthermore, if two lie down together, they
can keep each other warm, but how can one
person keep warm by himself?

¹² Although an assailant may overpower one
person, two can withstand him. Moreover, a
three-stranded cord is not quickly broken.

Read Hebrews 10:24-25

²⁴ And let us take thought of how to spur one
another on to love and good works, ²⁵ not
abandoning our own meetings, as some are in
the habit of doing, but encouraging each other,
and even more so because you see the day
drawing near.

3. What actions are carried out or commanded? Look for the verbs.
4. Is there anything repeated?
5. What is emphasized?
6. Is there anything in these passages that is related to other areas of scripture?

7. Are there things to be noted that are alike or unlike such as similes and metaphors?
