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## Using This Study

### ❶ EXAMINE His Word


What does God SAY? Open your time with prayer. The words God uses to communicate matters, so go back and pay close attention to the details that are emphasized or repeated in the passage.

### ❷ EXPLORE His Word

What does God MEAN? Asking questions of the text helps surface how the details relate to the message God wants to communicate.

### ❸ EMBRACE His Word

Why does it MATTER to me? Embrace God by responding to what you discover in His word in faith and obedience.



# NO FEAR

This will be our last week looking at Elijah. He has had a very powerful ministry being used by God to turn the hearts of the people back to God. God operates in powerful and dramatic ways during the life of Elijah yet Elijah still fears for his life at the hands of Jezebel. When Elijah runs away God repeatedly asks him why he is here. It is fear of Jezebel that drives Elijah to run away. After Elijah is ministered to in the wilderness God sends him back to complete what He has called him to do. Join us this week as we talk about overcoming our fear and doing what God has called us to do.

## 1 Kings 19:1-21 NASB

### Elijah Flees from Jezebel

**19** Now Ahab told Jezebel all that Elijah had done, and how he had killed all the prophets with the sword. <sup>2</sup> Then Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah, saying, "So may the gods do to me and even more, if I do not make your life as the life of one of them by tomorrow about this time." <sup>3</sup> And he was afraid and arose and ran for his life and came to Beersheba, which belongs to Judah, and left his servant there. <sup>4</sup> But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a juniper tree; and he requested for himself that he might die, and said, "It is enough; now, O LORD, take my life, for I am not better than my fathers." <sup>5</sup> He lay down and slept under a juniper tree; and behold, there was an angel touching him, and he said to him, "Arise, eat." <sup>6</sup> Then he looked and behold, there was at his head a bread cake *baked on* hot stones, and a jar of water. So he ate and drank and lay down again. <sup>7</sup> The angel of the LORD came again a second time and touched him and said, "Arise, eat, because the journey is too great for you." <sup>8</sup> So he arose and ate and drank, and went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb, the mountain of God.

### Elijah at Horeb

<sup>9</sup> Then he came there to a cave and lodged there; and behold, the word of

the LORD *came* to him, and He said to him, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" <sup>10</sup> He said, "I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts; for the sons of Israel have forsaken Your covenant, torn down Your altars and killed Your prophets with the sword. And I alone am left; and they seek my life, to take it away."

<sup>11</sup> So He said, "Go forth and stand on the mountain before the LORD." And behold, the LORD was passing by! And a great and strong wind was rending the mountains and breaking in pieces the rocks before the LORD; *but* the LORD *was* not in the wind. And after the wind an earthquake, *but* the LORD *was* not in the earthquake. <sup>12</sup> After the earthquake a fire, *but* the LORD *was* not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of a gentle blowing. <sup>13</sup> When Elijah heard *it*, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood in the entrance of the cave. And behold, a voice *came* to him and said, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" <sup>14</sup> Then he said, "I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts; for the sons of Israel have forsaken Your covenant, torn down Your altars and killed Your prophets with the sword. And I alone am left; and they seek my life, to take it away."

<sup>15</sup> The LORD said to him, "Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus, and when you have arrived, you shall anoint Hazael king over Aram; <sup>16</sup> and Jehu the son of Nimshi you shall anoint king over Israel; and Elisha the son

of Shaphat of Abel-meholah you shall anoint as prophet in your place. <sup>17</sup> It shall come about, the one who escapes from the sword of Hazael, Jehu shall put to death, and the one who escapes from the sword of Jehu, Elisha shall put to death. <sup>18</sup> Yet I will leave 7,000 in Israel, all the knees that have not bowed to Baal and every mouth that has not kissed him."

<sup>19</sup> So he departed from there and found Elisha the son of Shaphat, while he was plowing with twelve pairs of oxen before him, and he with the twelfth. And Elijah passed over to him

and threw his mantle on him. <sup>20</sup> He left the oxen and ran after Elijah and said, "Please let me kiss my father and my mother, then I will follow you." And he said to him, "Go back again, for what have I done to you?" <sup>21</sup> So he returned from following him, and took the pair of oxen and sacrificed them and boiled their flesh with the implements of the oxen, and gave it to the people and they ate. Then he arose and followed Elijah and ministered to him.

**What does God SAY? Prayerfully note significant details and terms emphasized in the foregoing passage.**

1. Who is involved in the text? Author, audience, main characters.
2. Where and when is this taking place? Geography and timeline.
3. What actions are carried out or commanded? Look for the verbs.
4. Is there anything repeated?
5. What is emphasized?
6. Is there anything in these passages that is related to other areas of scripture?
7. Are there things to be noted that are alike or unlike such as similes and metaphors?

12. Why do you think God reveals Himself the way He does?

13. What is significant about how Elisha is plowing?

14. Should we fear when there is a hostile ruler like Jezebel?

15. God continues to ask Elijah what he is doing there. What caused Elijah to be in that place?  
How can we avoid being off course like Elijah?

16. How does God reassure Elijah? How do you think He will reassure us?
